Students will be assessed on their ability to:

- insert a symbol of equality (>, <, or =) to make true number sentences</li>
- order decimals from smallest to largest
- write numbers between 2 whole numbers
  (ex: 2 numbers between 5 and 6 are 5.01 and 5.25)
- measure line segments to the nearest ½ centimeter (cm) and millimeter (mm)
- measure and draw line segments to the nearest ½ cm or mm
- write factors and multiples
- understand whether a number is prime or composite
- add and subtract decimals
- solve open sentences
- write decimals as fractions
- know what it means to withdraw and deposit money
- understand what value different base ten blocks represent when the block (big cube) is worth 1
